
Honesty: Honesty is the basis for personal and public trust.

Personnel Changes

NEW HIRES



The Police Department welcomed Officer Ryan Copeland to the department on June 6th. Ryan comes to us from the Janesville area where he lives with his wife. Ryan served in the United States Army for ten years, with the last seven years as a Special Forces Breen Beret. Ryan completed his education and academy at Black Hawk Technical College. Ryan became a police officer because he wanted to continue to serve after his military career and enjoys interacting with others and helping people. In his off-duty time Ryan likes hunting, fishing, and playing golf.



PART-TIME OFFICERS

The police department hired two part-time officers in 2013. The part-time officers fill shift vacancies that are created when full-time officers take accrued time off or are at training. Officer Aaron Tomlinson and Officer Adam Nachreiner were added to the part-time roster. Aaron currently works full-time at Fox Valley Technical College as a Criminal Justice Instructor. Adam is a full-time K-9 officer with the City of Monona Police Department.



Patrol Operations

The McFarland Police Department serves a community of 7,808 citizens. The Patrol Division is the most visible part of the Department. This division provides quality policing services to the community twenty-four hours a day using three shifts and relief personnel. The patrol officers respond to all calls for service to include; investigating criminal offenses, investigating motor vehicle crashes, conducting traffic enforcement, community policing and preventative patrol. The officers of the McFarland Police Department take pride in their efforts to provide efficient and effective police services to the residents of McFarland, along with those that work, visit, or travel through the Village.



The Department has 14 full-time sworn staff, which consists of the Chief, one Lieutenant, two Patrol Sergeants, one Detective, eight Patrol Officers, and one Police School Resource Officer. There are also five part-time sworn patrol officers. The clerical office is staffed by three non-sworn personnel including; Administrative Assistant Melissa Lavin, Police Clerk Bonnie Evans and part-time Police Clerk Sharon Ennis.

McFarland Police Officers constantly work towards achieving the department's mission to "enhance the quality of life". Our actions are guided by our values of sensitivity, honesty, accessibility, ethics, and accountability. Officers are also using community based policing strategies, which include community partnerships, along with problem-solving techniques to assist in our goals. Officers utilize squad cars, bicycles and foot-patrol to monitor the Village. There were 20 citizen ride-alongs conducted in 2013. The citizen ride-along is a simple way for officers to interact with citizens and teach the community about law enforcement and the police department.

Patrol officers are expected to handle a wide range of calls from barking dogs to burglaries. Calls for service vary depending on which shift an officer is working, day of the week, and season of the year. In 2013, the McFarland Police Department responded to 6,931 calls for service.

Detective Division



Conducting thorough and competent criminal investigations are a very important part of the services we offer to the community. For the most part, patrol officers handle the majority of investigative work needed to complete cases. At times, more complicated and time consuming cases are encountered that require a higher level of detail. These cases are turned over to the Detective Division. The McFarland Police Department currently has one full-time detective. Mike Klementz has been with the Department for 22 years and a detective since 2010. Detective Klementz drafted 27 search warrants in 2013.

Police/ School Liaison Officer

One of the responsibilities of the Police/School Liaison Officer (PSL) is to assist the Detective Division with criminal investigations that involve juveniles. The Police Department has assigned an officer as the Police/School Liaison since 1994. This officer's primary responsibilities include investigation of incidents that occur in the school setting, as well as those that significantly involve the youth of our community. This officer also acts as the Department's representative in various school and community groups. In addition to formal law enforcement activities, the PSL works to establish positive relationships with the students, faculty, and staff in all the schools. Officer John Miller has been the PSL since August 2010. Officer Miller maintains an office in the McFarland High School.

Officer Miller handled 122 calls for service at McFarland High School and 33 calls at the other McFarland schools. He also issued 55 Municipal citations for various violations. During the summer months, Officer Miller fills in for vacant patrol shifts and assists with investigations of major cases.





Community Outreach Programs

Community Outreach programs give McFarland Police Officers a chance to interact with the public in a different atmosphere and manner. The Department sponsored several events with the help of generous donations from citizens and businesses in the community.

BICYCLE RODEO

The annual McFarland Bicycle Rodeo took place in the Spring of 2013. The event was planned and coordinated by Officer Jason Onken and the McFarland Optimist Club. The Bike Rodeo is designed to reacquaint children with their bicycles after a long time off due to Winter. Each participant has the opportunity to have their bicycle inspected and tuned up by a technician. The child is then put through a skills assessment course and taught specific riding rules and skills to help make the upcoming Summer safe for all. Several children received awards and bicycle helmets for their performance in the skills assessment. Four bicycles were also given away during the awards ceremony. The event was staffed and sponsored by members of the McFarland Optimist Club and the McFarland Police Department.

Police Department K-9 Unit



The K9 Unit is being established as a means of enhancing the department's drug interdiction program. The K9 will be cross trained in drug detection, suspect apprehension and the ability to track lost or missing persons. Since beginning fund-raising in late 2012, the department now has approximately \$ 22,000 to use towards the K9 Unit. This is enough to proceed with the implementation, which is scheduled for the Spring of 2014. Training

In-Service Training

Each officer in the State of Wisconsin is required to complete a minimum of 24 hours of training on an annual basis. The McFarland Police Department is part of a Suburban Training Consortium consisting of 4 area police departments. McFarland Police Officers attended five (5) eight hour in-service sessions. During these sessions, officers train in firearms (handgun and rifle), defense and arrest tactics, emergency vehicle operations, legal updates, vehicle contacts, rapid deployment for an active shooter, and Taser. Training was primarily conducted at the Dane County Shooting Range in Waunakee and the new Madison Police Department Training Academy.

Specialized Training

Along with the annual in-service training, officers have the opportunity to attend other law enforcement related training. Some of the courses taken were:

Department Sponsored Training

The Department hosted a Seated Standardized Field Sobriety class in September. The class is designed to teach officers how to conduct field sobriety tests on individuals who cannot stand on their feet due to a traffic crash or some other form of disability.

The Department also hosted a Legal Update training. The training was conducted by Wisconsin Assistant AG Dave Perlman and Tara Jenswold-Schipper from the Wisconsin Department of Justice. The training covered topics such as recent case law and changes to the Wisconsin criminal and traffic laws.





Traffic Enforcement

Traffic enforcement and education of drivers is always a high priority for officers. The Department receives driving complaints on a regular basis and deploys officers where needed. The Department utilizes a traffic counter to help direct enforcement efforts. In 2013, officers conducted a total of 2,939 traffic stops. Included in this total were 2,216 warnings, 673 stops with citations issued, and 50 intoxicated drivers.



The Department also participated in an OWI HVE deployment campaign. HVE stands for **H**igh **V**isibility **E**nforcement. The campaign focused on drunk driving enforcement and education. Each deployment had officers from the participating agencies working together within each Department’s jurisdiction, on separate dates.

2013 Cases of Interest



01-01-2013 Officers were dispatched to a vehicle on fire in the 5900 block of Holscher Road. The responding officer arrived on scene and found the vehicle was fully engulfed in flames. Fire Department personnel arrived and the fire was extinguished. It was then found there were two deceased individuals inside the burnt vehicle.

01-01-2013 Officers received a complaint of a vehicle that was operating recklessly in the area. The vehicle was located and a traffic stop was made. The driver was found to be under the influence of alcohol and arrested. The driver was charged with operating a motor vehicle while under the influence-6th offense and open intoxicants in a motor vehicle. Blood alcohol results are pending but the preliminary breath test showed the driver had a .155 blood alcohol concentration.

01-01-2013 An officer was dispatched to a business in the 5100 block of Erling Avenue for a reported theft. The officer made contact with the suspect in the case. At one point during the contact, the suspect reached up and struck the officer in the face. The suspect was eventually taken into custody after a brief struggle and charged with battery to a law enforcement officer, disorderly conduct, resisting arrest and theft. The suspect was booked into the Dane County Jail on the charges.

01-04-2013 An officer was dispatched to a business in the 4100 block of Terminal Drive for a burglary. The officer completed his investigation and turned the case over to the detective for follow-up investigation. Later in the month, two suspects were identified and eventually charged with the burglary to the business.

02-04-2013 Officers were dispatched to the 5100 block of Broadhead Street for a domestic disturbance. Officers arrived and learned the suspect had fled from the residence. During the interview of the victim, officers found out the male suspect had armed himself with a knife at one point during the argument. The suspect was eventually located and charged with domestic related disorderly conduct and disorderly conduct while armed.

02-08-2013 Officers were dispatched to the 6300 block of Exchange Street for a domestic disturbance. Officers arrived and met the complainant outside the residence. During the investigation officers learned both subjects engaged in a verbal and physical altercation that resulted in one subject being struck in the face several times and the other one was bitten. The male subject was arrested for domestic related disorderly conduct and battery.

03-09-2013 Officers were made aware of a possible prescription fraud case at the McFarland Hometown Pharmacy. Officers coordinated surveillance of the business and eventually made contact with the suspect. The suspect, along with another individual, was detained for questioning. After the interviews were completed the female suspect was arrested for 13 different charges to include: six counts of obtaining a prescription by fraud, four counts of illegal possession of a prescription, possession with intent to deliver a prescription, and two counts of bail jumping.

03-09-2013 While the above listed case was taking place, officers were dispatched to Walgreen's for another prescription fraud case. Officers responded to the business and made contact with a female suspect from Minnesota. Officers conducted their investigation and eventually arrested the suspect for obtaining a prescription by fraud.

03-29-2013 Officers were dispatched to the McFarland Hometown Pharmacy for a robbery that had just occurred. Officers arrived on scene and initially set up a perimeter around the business. An officer made contact with employees and learned a suspect had entered the store and displayed a note to the pharmacy employees. The note asked for two specific medications to be placed in a bag. The pharmacists complied with the suspect who then fled the store on foot. The suspect was last seen running north east from the business toward Taylor Road. A canine from the City of Madison was used to attempt a track on the suspect. The track was unsuccessful. The suspect may be involved in several other pharmacy robberies in Dane County.

04-04-2013 Officers, along with the McFarland Fire Department, were dispatched to the area of Spartan Drive for a grass fire. The fire was extinguished and it appeared the fire was intentionally set. Officers were eventually able to identify two subjects who were involved and interviewed them. The two individuals eventually admitted to lighting grass and sticks on fire which then caused the larger fire to happen. Both subjects were issued citations for negligent handling of burning materials.

04-04-2013 Officers were dispatched to a report of a moped crash on Siggelkow Road at Highway 51. Officers arrived on scene and made contact with moped driver who had obvious injuries to his face. McFarland EMS provided medical care to the driver while the officers investigated the cause of the crash. An officer began to interview the driver and found he was under the influence of alcohol. The driver was arrested for operating a motor vehicle while under the influence-first offense. The driver had a preliminary alcohol level of .208.

04-11-2013 Officers were dispatched to the area of Lewis Lane and Lani Lane for a subject that was disturbing some workers and armed with a hatchet. Officers arrived on scene and observed the suspect standing in the middle of the road and he was armed with the hatchet. Officers began giving verbal commands to the suspect to "drop the weapon" but the suspect did not immediately comply. The suspect did eventually comply but would not respond to any other of the officer commands. The suspect was eventually wrestled to the ground and secured in handcuffs. The suspect was charged with disorderly conduct while armed and taken to jail.

04-18-2013 Officers were dispatched to the McFarland High School for what dispatch described as a large fight in progress. Several officers and Dane County Sheriff Deputies responded to the school. Officers arrived on scene and entered the school and observed school staff had one student detained on the ground. Officers learned the fight actually only involved two students. An investigation was conducted and one subject was charged with battery and the second subject was charged with disorderly conduct while armed.

04-30-2013 Officers were dispatched to a business on Meinders Road for subjects that were breaking into storage lockers. Officers arrived on scene and observed two subjects who appeared to be loading items into a vehicle that was parked in the lot of the business next door to the storage units. The suspects observed one of the officers and began to run from the location. After a brief foot pursuit, one of the suspects was caught. The second suspect was tracked, using a canine from the Sheriff's Department, that was unsuccessful. The one suspect confessed to being involved in taking items from the storage locker.

05-22-2013 School Resource Officer Miller received information that a student was going to bring a scheduled prescription medication to school and sell it to another student. Officer Miller conducted an investigation and was able to stop the transaction from taking place. The suspect did not have a prescription for the medication and would not disclose where they received it from. The suspect was arrested and charged with possession with intent to deliver a schedule II narcotic on school property.

06-08-2013 Officers were dispatched to a motion alarm inside the McFarland high School. Officers from McFarland, Monona, and the Dane County Sheriff's Office responded to the call. Officers found a window had been opened and it appeared someone had entered the building. Officers set up a perimeter around the school and began to search the interior. Officers found damage done to the interior of the school but no suspect(s) were located. The Department was able to obtain surveillance video from the school and are attempting to identify a suspect.

2013 Cases of Interest



06-16-2013 Officers were dispatched to the intersection of Siggelkow Road and Erling Avenue for a serious two vehicle traffic crash. Officers arrived on scene and observed a pick-up truck had rolled over several times and a second vehicle was in the ditch next to the railroad tracks. Officers were assisted by the Dane County Sheriff's Office along with McFarland EMS and Fire Departments. Emergency personnel were dealing with six injured subjects. Two subjects were transported by Med Flight Helicopters. The Sheriff's Department assisted in reconstructing the traffic crash using their reconstruction personnel. Investigation showed the driver of one of the vehicles had a medical issue that contributed to the cause of the crash. No enforcement action was taken.

06-18-2013 Officers were dispatched to the 6300 block of Johnson Street for a domestic related disturbance. Officers interviewed the victim involved and learned a verbal and physical disturbance had taken place in the home and in a vehicle. Officers interviewed the male suspect and eventually arrested him for domestic related disorderly conduct and 4th degree sexual assault.

06-22-2013 Officers were dispatched to the 4900 block of Burma Road for a physical domestic that took place. Officers arrived on scene and learned the male suspect had battered the female victim. The officers eventually arrested the male suspect for domestic related battery and disorderly conduct.

06-23-2013 An officer stopped a vehicle for a routine traffic violation. The officer quickly identified the driver as a wanted felony offender. All three occupants were known heroin users. The driver was arrested for the felony warrant and the vehicle was searched. During the search, officers located several drug paraphernalia items directly related to the use of heroin. The passenger was arrested for possession of drug paraphernalia.

06-29-2013 Officers were dispatched to the area of Exchange Street and Farwell Street for a reckless vehicle that may have left the roadway. Around the same time this call came in, another person reported a reckless vehicle on Highway 51 near Farwell Street. Both vehicle descriptions were similar. Officers were able to eventually locate the suspect vehicle and driver in the area of Larson Park. The driver ran from officers when they attempted contact with him. The 16 year old driver was caught and found to be under the influence of alcohol. The driver was charged with operating a motor vehicle while under the influence, resisting/obstructing an officer, and hit and run to property adjacent to a highway.

07-16-2013 Officers were dispatched to the 4700 block of Burma Road for a domestic disturbance. Officer arrived on scene and made contact with the two involved subjects. Officers learned there was a verbal argument that took place with the suspect damaging some of his property and arming himself with a knife. The male suspect was eventually arrested for domestic related disorderly conduct while armed with a dangerous weapon.

08-03-2013 Officers were dispatched to the 5000 block of Marsh Road for a domestic related disturbance. Officers originally were sent to the location for two 911 hang-up calls. When they arrived, the officers witnessed a physical and verbal altercation taking place. The officers had to immediately take action before an injury occurred. The officers learned there was a verbal altercation that led to the female attempting to call 911 two times. The male subject took the phone from the female, preventing her from calling for help. The male subject was eventually arrested and charged with 2 counts of intimidation of a victim, disorderly conduct, and false imprisonment. The male subject was also charged with violating a temporary restraining order for calling the female victim from the jail

08/09/2013 An officer on routine patrol noticed a vehicle on Main Street that was driving very poorly. The officer continued to follow the vehicle and eventually made a traffic stop. The driver was contacted and found to be under the influence of alcohol. The driver was put through a series of field sobriety tests and arrested for operating a motor vehicle while under the influence. The driver's blood alcohol concentration was a .28, over three times the legal limit.

08/18/2013 An officer on routine patrol observed a vehicle and driver which appeared to be attempting to avoid the officer. The officer stopped the vehicle and upon running the registration found it to be stolen. A high risk traffic stop was conducted on the vehicle and two occupants were taken into custody without incident. The vehicle had been reported stolen two earlier in the City of Madison. Both occupants blamed each other for the theft and were charged with operating a motor vehicle without the owner's consent.

08/22/2013 An officer was conducting an investigation and attempting to locate three wanted subjects. The officer was at one of the individual's homes when the three suspects showed up. The officer was able to detain all three subjects and place them under arrest. The subjects were transported to the Dane County Jail and booked in for the outstanding warrants.

09-10-2013 Officers were dispatched to the 4700 block of Burma Road for a domestic related disturbance. Officers were dispatched using the emergency tones because the male suspect was armed with a knife. Officers arrived on scene and learned the suspect had left in a vehicle. The victim told officers she was battered by the suspect, had a knife held to her throat, and had property taken from her. The suspect was contacted and voluntarily returned to the location. The suspect was arrested for domestic related 2nd degree reckless endangerment and battery.

09-19-2013 Officers were dispatched to the 4700 block of Dale Street for the report of a subject breaking into a vehicle. While in route to the call, officers were told the suspect ran from the area. Officers began checking the area and eventually located the suspect. The suspect confessed to being inside one of the vehicles but he did not take anything. The suspect was cited for trespass to an unlocked vehicle and taken to jail on a probation hold.

10-01-2013 Officers were dispatched to the 4800 block of Dale Street for a domestic related disturbance. Officers arrived on scene and could hear the sounds of a disturbance coming from inside the apartment. Officers made contact with a male and female inside the apartment. The male subject was eventually arrested for domestic related criminal damage to property, disorderly conduct, and battery along with felony bail jumping.

10-18-2013 Officers were dispatched to the Citgo at 4004 Terminal drive to check the welfare of a female juvenile inside a vehicle. Officers arrived on scene and the vehicle had left prior to their arrival. Officers learned the complainant had observed a partially nude female juvenile in the backseat of a vehicle. The vehicle description was made available to the public but we could not obtain a license plate from the video surveillance. The investigation continued in the days following and the occupants of the vehicle were found in Florida. The Department requested assistance from Jacksonville Police Department to check the welfare of the female. It was learned the female had a drink spilled on her by her brother and she had been changing her clothes when the witness observed her in the vehicle. No foul play was uncovered and the case was closed.
