JUNE 2019 MONTHLY REPORT

As observed on the attached Call Summary Report, the McFarland Police Department logged 734 cases in June. This is compared to 834 cases for the same time in 2018. Cases of interest for the month were: seventeen intoxicated drivers, two domestic disturbances, three disturbances, two juvenile complaints, seven thefts, twenty-eight traffic accidents, forty-six EMS/Fire assists, six drug investigations, two weapons calls, and responded to eight alarms. Officers also logged 239 traffic incidents during this month.

Cases of Interest

06/03/2019 An officer stopped a vehicle for a routine traffic violation. The officer made contact with the driver and found her to be under the influence of alcohol. Field sobriety tests were conducted and probable cause was established to arrest the driver for operating a motor vehicle while under the influence-5th offense. The driver was also cited for operating with a revoked driver's license. The driver had a blood alcohol concentration of .14 on the PBT and official toxicology results are still pending.

06/18/2019 Officers were dispatched to the 5000 block of N. Autumn Lane for a suicidal male subject that had just been in a fight with his girlfriend. While heading to the call, officers were informed the male subject had armed himself with two large knives and the female was locked in a basement room. Officers arrived on scene and were able to safely get the female out of the residence. Officers attempted verbal communication with the male subject but did not receive a response. K-9 Officer Job and Boris were deployed into the residence and male was found in an upstairs bathroom. The male had both knives to his throat and threatened to kill himself if we attempted to arrest him. The male made comments about charging at us so we would shoot him. At this time officers had less lethal options (bean bag rounds and Taser) ready to deploy if needed. After 15 minutes of negotiation with the male, he surrendered to the officers. The subject was transported to Detox and then eventually to jail the next day. The male was charged with disorderly conduct while armed, battery, intimidation of a victim, and failure to comply with an officer's attempt to take into custody.

06/19/2019 Officers were dispatched to the 6300 block of Sighting Road for a physical domestic with injuries. Officers arrived on scene and made contact with a female subject who had injuries to her head and stomach. EMS was summoned to the scene and the female was eventually transported to a hospital for care. The female stated she was involved in a verbal altercation with her boyfriend that turned physical. During the altercation the male kicked the female in the stomach, hit her in the head with a metal thermos, and hit her in the head with his hand. The male subject had fled the scene prior to the arrival of the police but was stopped in Monona a short time later. The male was arrested and charged with domestic related battery and disorderly conduct and transported to the Dane County Jail.

06/24/2019 Officers were dispatched to the 4800 block of Dale Street for a report of a female passed out in a vehicle parked on the street. Officers arrived on scene and made contact with the female who was now awake but appeared to be under the influence of something. Officers identified the female as a known user or heroine and called for a K-9 unit to sniff the vehicle. The dog alerted on the vehicle and a search was conducted. During the search several items of contraband were found to include drug paraphernalia, cocaine, prescription medications, and a cutting agent for the cocaine. The female was charged with

possession of cocaine, possession of drug paraphernalia, possession of a prescription drug without a prescription, and felony bail jumping. The female was transported to the Dane County Jail.

06/30/2019 Officers were dispatched to the intersection of Holscher Road and Prairie Wood Drive for a report of a female passed out in a vehicle. Officers were on their way to the call when dispatched informed them the vehicle was now leaving the area. An officer located the vehicle at the intersection of Farwell Street and Exchange Street and attempted a traffic stop. The vehicle began to accelerate away from the officer and a short pursuit ensued. The officer terminated the pursuit a short time later. The officer then overhead a County Deputy had spikes set up out in front of the fleeing vehicle and was able to effectively deploy them. The vehicle was now traveling east on US HWY 12/18 from HWY AB. The officer started to pursue after the suspect vehicle once again and could observe the tires were deflating and actually falling apart. The vehicle came to a stop in the middle of the highway at Femrite Drive. The female driver then ran from the vehicle but was eventually caught by officers. The driver was under the influence of narcotics and was arrested for operating a motor vehicle while under the influence-3rd offense. The driver was transported to the hospital for a blood draw. While at the hospital, the female attempted to escape from the officer before she was tackled and taken into custody. The female had to be restrained using leg restraints, along with handcuffs, as she was kicking at the officer. The female was taken to the Dane County Jail and also charged with 2 counts of resisting an officer, possession of drug paraphernalia, knowingly fleeing an officer (vehicle), operating after revocation, felony bail jumping, and three outstanding warrants.

Staffing Report

- During the month of June, we gained back one of our injured officers, and are now operating just one officer short until August.
- Our Police Clerk III recruitment process continues. Initial interviews were conducted, with a list of 5 semi-finalists identified following those interviews. Unfortunately, four of the five withdrew from the process, mostly due to the hours of the position. We are now planning a second round of interviews for mid-July.

Budget Report

- Our situation with staffing shortages relating to injured officers continues to put us over budget as compared to where we should be in terms of overtime expenditures. We will continue to monitor this as the year progresses.

Training Report

- Sgt. Jeremy Job attending a Tactical Response Instructor training at Madison College. The training was for four days and will allow him to instruct at Active Threat trainings.
- Officer Bruce Grady attended Advanced Roadside Impaired Driver Enforcement training. The training focuses on different ways to detect and test drivers who may be under the influence of drugs. The two day class was held at the Madison Police Department training facility.

Other Information

- Our department hosted the Community Shared Table event on June 27th, with around 200 attendees.
- Our Tip411 Program is live and functioning. To date, we have received numerous tips via the system, and it appears to be functioning as intended.
- Sergeant Nate Jacobsen graduated from the Northwestern University School of Police Staff and Command on Friday, June 21st.
